



Coles, Telstra hold out as employers drop vaccination mandates

Employers are dropping their requirements for staff and visitors to be vaccinated from COVID-19 as the risk of the virus wanes, but some major employers including Coles and Telstra have decided to keep them.

Office workplaces such as law firms and professional services and some manufacturers have moved away from the mandate after considering drops in cases, high community vaccination rates and changes to public health orders.
